

## PLACES OF INTEREST

- Bothwell was settled by Scottish graziers in the 1820's.
- View 53 classified buildings, some of these house arts, crafts, collectibles and old wares, or provide accommodation.
- Bothwell is also home of the Tasmanian Tartan, Nant Whiskey Distillery, a unique four faced vertical sun dial built as First World War Memorial and the historic General Cemetery.
- The Australasian Golf Museum is situated in a Gothic style, sandstone school house of historical significance.
- Ratho, in Bothwell is the oldest golf course in the Southern Hemisphere, golf was played at Bothwell some time before 1840.
- The Fat Doe Bakery – Venison pie.
